#### **Kindergarten Registration Week:**

A reminder that Kindergarten Registration Week is January 27-31, 2025.

All registration is online. Kindergarten registration will open at 8 a.m. on Monday, January 27th.

To register a student in Kindergarten, a parent or legal guardian must provide school-age eligibility (*children must reach five years of age by December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2025* to be eligible for enrolment), proof of Canadian citizenship(or Canadian immigration document), and proof of residential address. This information must be provided during online registration.

#### **Late French Immersion Registration Week:**

Any student entering Grade 6 can enroll in Late French Immersion in the Greater Victoria School District. Late French Immersion is offered at four dual-track middle schools. Registration for Late French Immersion occurs online from January 27<sup>th</sup>-31st 2025. Families who register during registration week will have priority for placement.

#### <u>Playground and Parking Safety - Important Information Items</u>

- Please talk with your children about playground safety. Keep sticks, pinecones and acorns on the ground, and do not pick any mushrooms or approach any birds or animals.
- Our parking lot is reserved for staff; we encourage you to park at Maynard Park and enjoy the short, scenic walk up the path to our school. It's a great way to start the day, connect to the land, and helps to set a positive, active tone for our students.
- Our pull through cannot accommodate all families who drive their children to school, please consider parking and walking up.

#### **Dogs on School Property:**

We kindly request your cooperation in ensuring our school remains a safe and welcoming environment for all students. As you may know, several of our students are sensorily sensitive and may find the presence of dogs on school grounds during drop-off, pick-up, and throughout the day challenging.

While we understand the important role pets play in our families' lives, we ask that all community pets remain off school property during school hours. This helps us prioritize all students' comfort, safety, and well-being.

# **Health and Safety:**

Schools being allergy-aware is crucial in creating a safe and inclusive environment for all students. As more children are diagnosed with severe allergies to foods, insects, and environmental factors, schools are implementing safety steps that address these needs. Allergy awareness involves educating staff, students, and parents about the risks and preventive measures associated with allergens and training staff in emergency response procedures, such as administering epinephrine. Schools are allergy-friendly, meaning avoiding specific food items in particular classrooms to minimize the chances of accidental exposure, but also being mindful when we are in school with what scents we are wearing, not bringing pets to school, and what is packed in our lunches. Allergens such as peanuts are not banned in schools, but we want all community members to know that our school has nut sensitivities and allergies. Schools help protect students' health by promoting allergy awareness and ensuring they feel comfortable and supported throughout their learning experience.

Common allergens: nuts, pollen, insects, latex, milk, soy, perfume/scents, eggs, fish/shellfish

#### **Lost and Found:**
