Kindergarten Registration Week:

A reminder that Kindergarten Registration Week is January 26-30, 2026. All registration is online. Kindergarten registration will open at 8 a.m. on Monday, January 26th.To register a student in Kindergarten, a parent or legal guardian must provide school-age eligibility (*children must reach five years of age by December 31st*, 2026 to be eligible for enrolment), proof of Canadian citizenship(or Canadian immigration document), and proof of residential address. This information must be provided during online registration.

Late French Immersion Registration Week:

Any student entering Grade 6 can enroll in Late French Immersion in the Greater Victoria School District. Late French Immersion is offered at four dual-track middle schools. No prior knowledge of French is expected or required. Transportation is the responsibility of parents. Our Late French Immersion page provides more information about the program.

Registration for Late French Immersion occurs online from January 26th-30th 2026. Families who register during registration week will have priority for placement.

Health and Safety:

Schools being allergy-aware is crucial in creating a safe and inclusive environment for all students. As more children are diagnosed with severe allergies to foods, insects, and environmental factors, schools are implementing safety steps that address these needs.

Allergy awareness involves educating staff, students, and parents about the risks and preventive measures associated with allergens and training staff in emergency response procedures, such as administering epinephrine. Schools are allergy-friendly, meaning avoiding specific food items in particular classrooms to minimize the chances of accidental exposure, but also being mindful when we are in school with what scents we are wearing, not bringing pets to school, and what is packed in our lunches.

Allergens such as peanuts are not banned in schools, but we want all community members to know that our school has nut sensitivities and allergies – we are an allergy aware school. Schools help protect students' health by promoting allergy awareness and ensuring they feel comfortable and supported throughout their learning experience.

Common allergens: nuts, pollen, insects, latex, milk, soy, perfume/scents, eggs, fish/shellfish

Lost and Found:

The Lost and Found is once again, filling up! Jackets, pants, sweaters, shirts, water bottles, thermoses, masks, hats ... you name it, we've got it! The Lost and Found will be displayed in the school entryway during the first two weeks of December. Please come take a look.

Weather and Outside Time:

With the stormy, cold and wet weather moving in, our school playgrounds are getting muddier if possible, please send your child(ren) to school with INDOOR SHOES so we can keep our classes and hallways clean.

You may even want to send a change of clothes if your child is younger. Our students play outside regardless of the weather, please make sure they are dressed appropriately. Play in the forest area is limited on wind warning days, as indicated by Environment Canada.
